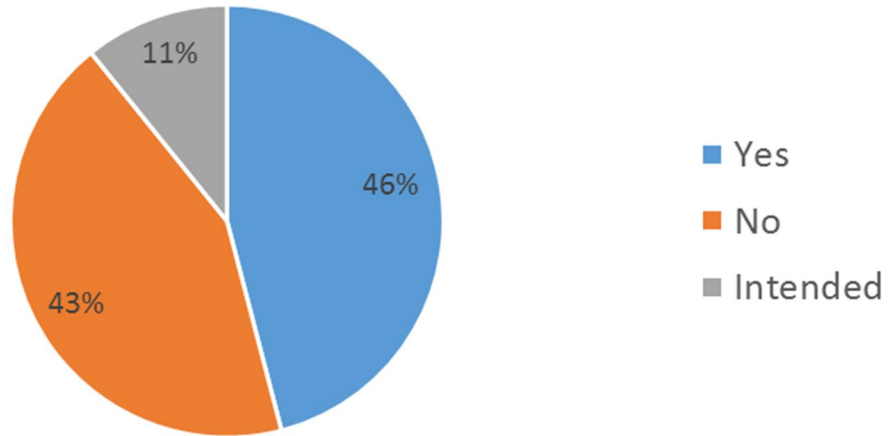

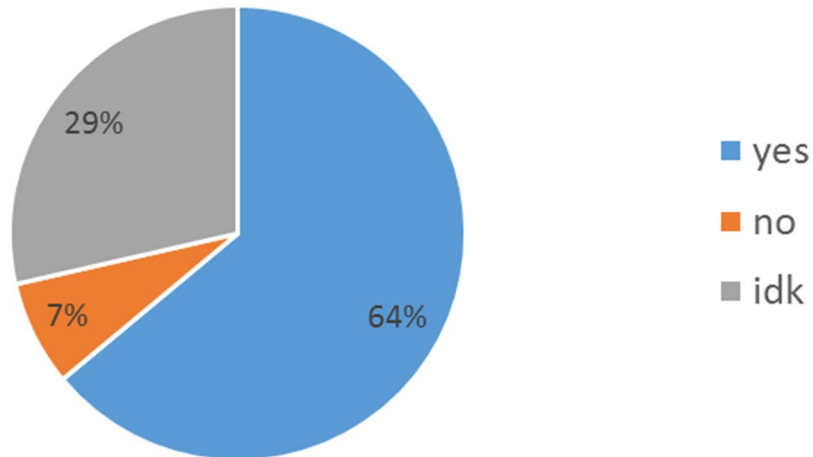

Are you currently active in using our land and resources for personal use (hunting, fishing, trapping, gathering, or cultural/ceremonial uses)?



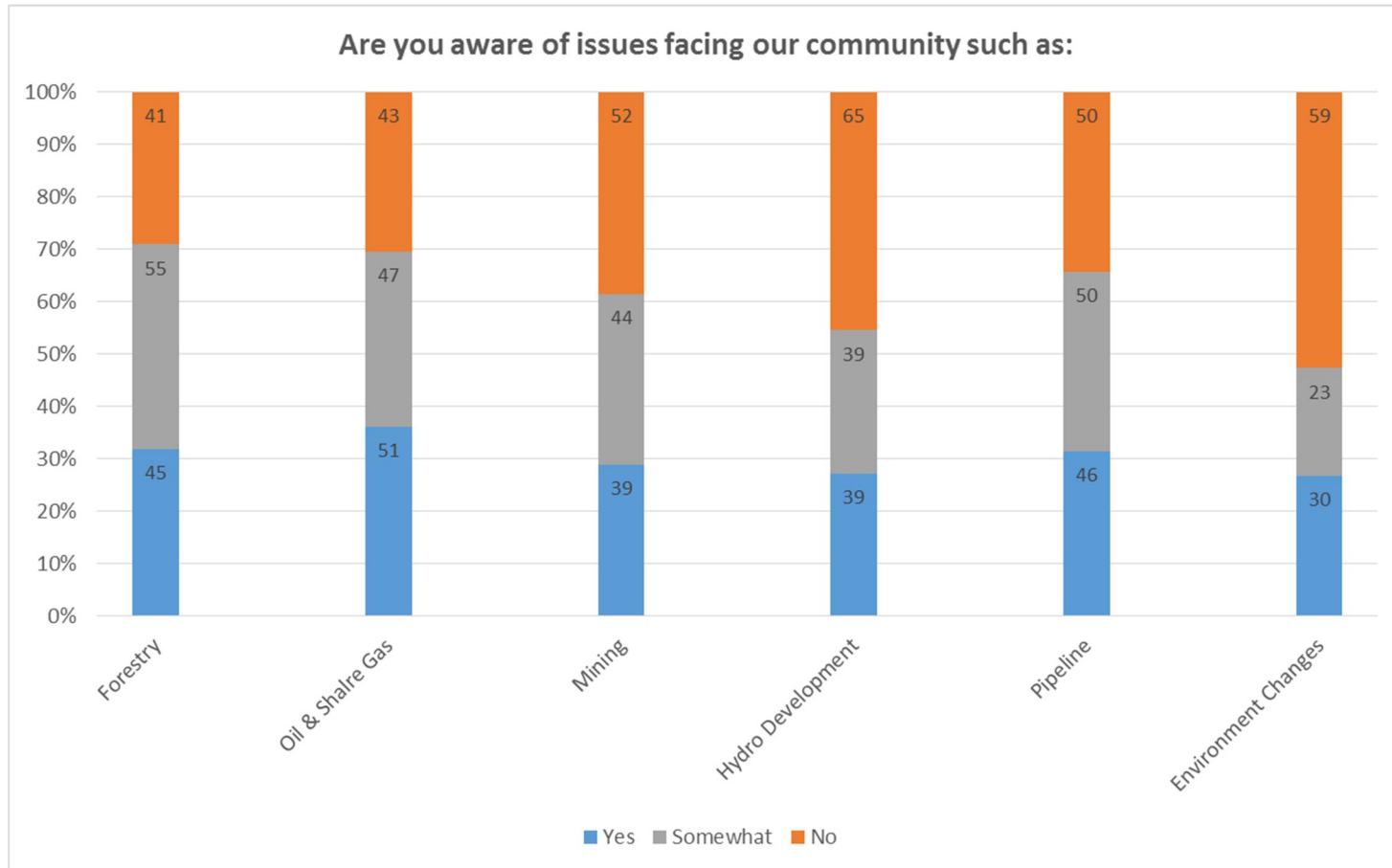
Depending on the type of project and how significant the benefits may be to TFN, are you open to consenting to a project in exchange for an Impact & Benefit Agreement (IBA) ?

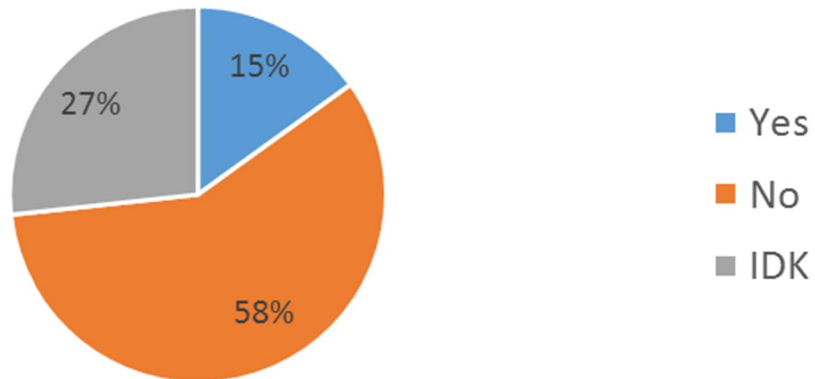

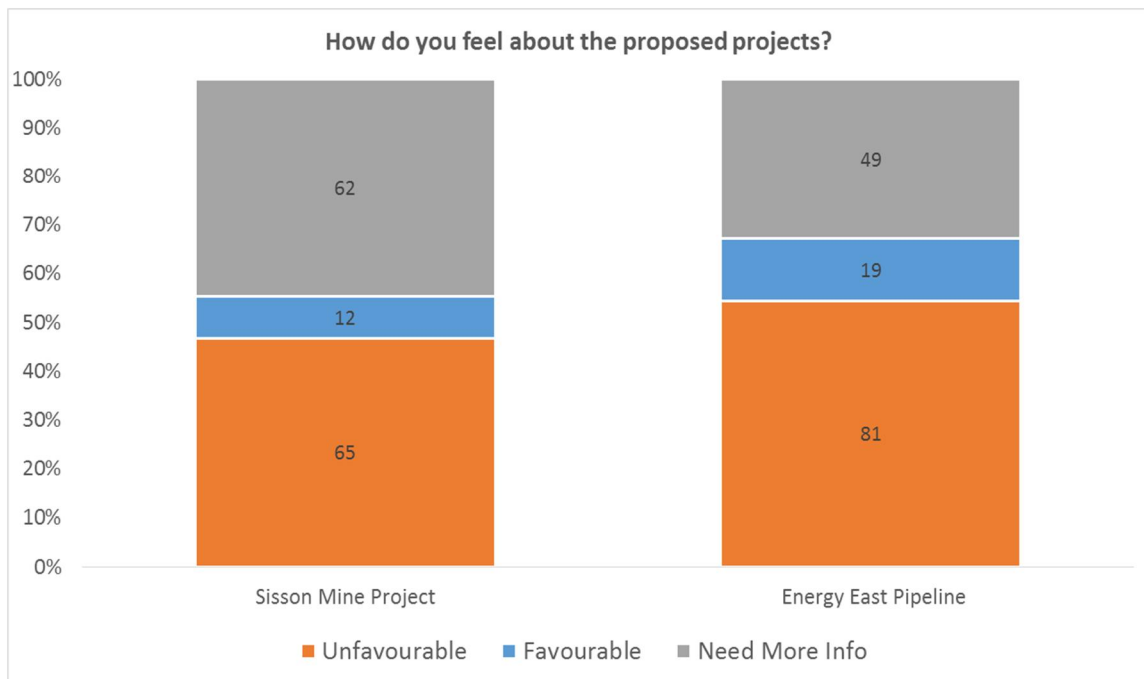

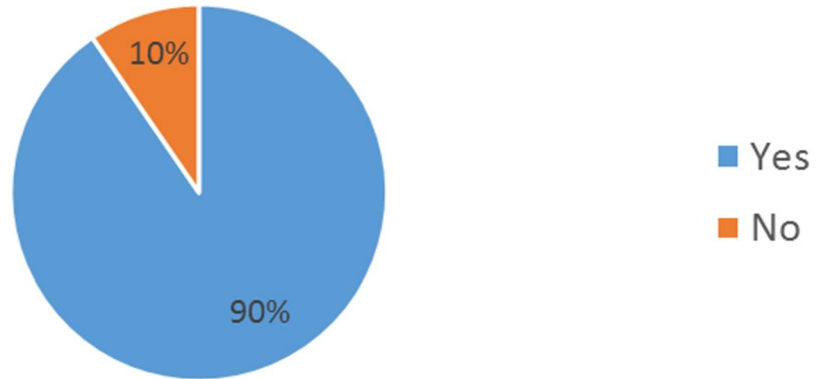

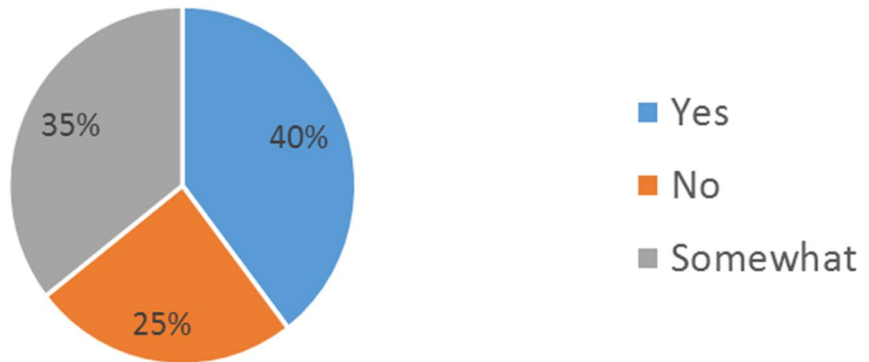

Would you attend community information sessions on proposed resource developments such as the Energy East pipeline, Sisson Brook Mine, etc.?



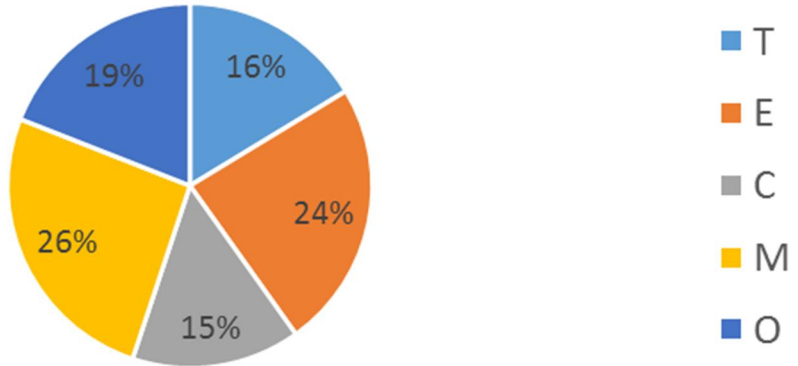
Do you feel your attendance and your opinions in community meetings make a difference?
