Dear Chief and Council,

This letter comprises a brief summary report of the archaeological monitoring recently completed at the proposed bridge crossing located at Moose Brook South (CiDq-3) in Mount Carleton Provincial Park.

On September 26, 2016 a permitted archaeologist, a Mi'kmaq and a Wolastoqiyik archaeological field technician were present on site to monitor the excavation for the south abutment of the proposed bridge. This area was previously subject to a controlled excavation in August 2016 that recovered three Pre-Contact artifacts. Only the area subject to archaeological investigation was permitted to be disturbed by the contractor while being monitored by the archaeologist and technicians.

All planned excavation for the abutment at Moose Brook South was completed on September 26, 2016 and no additional archaeological resources were identified.

With the completion of this work, all planned archaeological assessment and monitoring has been undertaken at Moose Brook South (CiDq-3) and Bathurst Lake North (CiDq-2). Should additional ground disturbance be required at either location, an archaeologist and two indigenous archaeological field technicians will be present on site to monitor the work.
